



The 2025 Doco in a Day challenge brought together 289 students from across Australia, all using the power of storytelling to highlight the importance of education. In just one school day, they created 87 short documentaries – each full of creativity, purpose, and heart.

Judges Sal Balharrie and Archie Chew were impressed by the depth and originality of the entries. Team UNT from St Patrick's College Strathfield took out the Best Doco award, winning a trip to East Africa in 2026. Team 11 from St Joseph's College Geelong was named Runner-Up, earning a \$500 JB Hi-Fi voucher sponsored by Paywise. Highly Commended entries went to Jayden C (St Joseph's Gregory Terrace), Team DCA (Christian Brothers College), and Team 1 (Parade College).

In the fundraising category, **Aaradhya U from St Joseph's Nudgee College** received the top individual award, while **Team BEP from St Pius** X claimed the team prize, supported by Paywise and JB Hi-Fi.

The initiative not only celebrated storytelling and creativity but also made a real impact by raising funds for education programs worldwide. **Doco in a Day will return in 2026**


## Addressing the UNITED NATIONS

For our participants, the immersion was more than a trip — it was an encounter with hope, humanity, and remarkable resilience.






Participants returned home inspired to take meaningful action — whether through advocacy, fundraising, or simply shifting the way they see and engage with the world.

Raised in the heart of Kibera, one of Kenya's largest urban slums, Bria\* faced overwhelming challenges. Despite the odds, she completed her primary education but an unplanned pregnancy as a teen forced her to put her dreams on hold.

Through Mirror of Hope's Future Poa (Cool Future) project, Bria found strength in a supportive environment. She gained practical skills in tailoring, received counselling support and learned about self-care, entrepreneurship and life-skills to rebuild her confidence and independence.

and encouraged to thrive.


Children learn alongside their peers in an inclusive setting, building confidence, friendships, and a strong sense of belonging. Families also receive practical training and support, helping them to better care for and advocate for their children.

Kurt shared how meaningful it is to see Mukuru children experiencing inclusive education and opportunity. We are grateful for his ongoing advocacy, presence, and belief in what is possible when every child is given the chance to learn and grow


Amalia now has financial stability and can afford not only daily necessities to provides for her family but savings for emergencies and healthcare.
